

## Science: rocks and soils

Fossil– the remains of a pre-historic plant, insect or animal that is embedded in rock and preserved.



Amber– A hard, translucent, yellow fossil which comes from trees and often has an insect trapped inside.



Paleontologist– a scientist who studies fossilised plants and animals.

Sedimentary rock– a rock which has layers of mud and sand and where fossils are often found.



Preserved– to keep something so that it remains the same as it has always been.

Permeable– a material that allows liquid to pass through it.

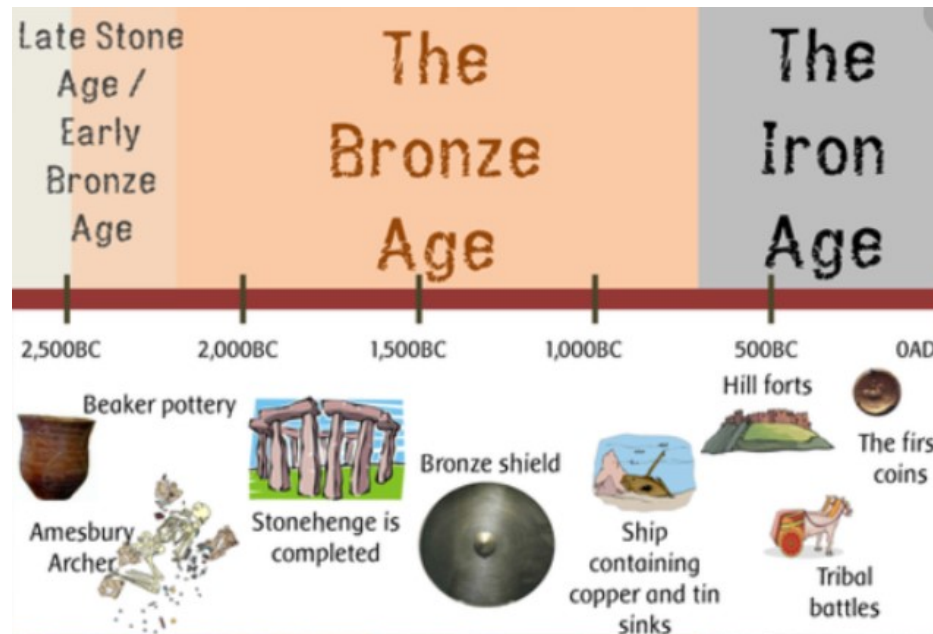
Non-permeable– a material that does not allow liquid to pass through it.

Brahman– the overall god that Hindu's worship.

Aum– a symbol of the gods and a special word to start prayers.

Remains– the parts of historical relics that have been left over.

Stone circles– a circle of standing stone put up in pre-historic times. It is believed that they were used to observe the sun and moon and were also a place of worship.
