Key achievements to date until July 2019:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The percentage of children taking part in extra-curricular activities has increased from 25.1% in 2012 to a peak of 45.5% in 2018. • Increased participation and success in competitive sports. • PE lead completed qualification in level 5 and level 6 specialism in Primary School PE. • Wider range of sports are now available for children to participate in – after school / lunch time clubs – squash, boccia and gymnastics for example. • Increased confidence and knowledge of staff in teaching high quality PE lessons, measured through staff questionnaires. • Play Leaders have helped to structure KS1 playtimes. • In school events have been a success and have helped to raise the profile of PE across the school.
